#### TOUR CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The weather favored us for the November/December 2014 ride from the Huckleberry restaurant in Benicia to the Jellystone Park resort in Cobb; the forecast 2-day break in heavy rain arrived just as we met at the restaurant. Huckleberry gave us a private room and good service. Buddy and Mini stopped by on their way to Kona to deliver the new T-shirts and polos to us. They look nice!

The group of 9 riders included the returning non-member Jerry McHugh (who could only ride part way) and Justin Adams who recently fled Michigan weather on his F800GS. Again, John Ellis did sweep for us, and escorted a straggler to the meet point at Lower Lake.

The route took Pleasants Valley Road to Sonoma Lake Park. There may have been a couple riders who haven't ridden that favorite road, and the park could make a nice close-in camping spot. On Berryessa-Knoxville we were blessed with just enough overflow in 3 of the stream crossings; a nice splash but nothing slippery. We took a lunch break in Lower Lake, split between Danny's BBQ and Foster's Freeze, then across the ridge to the campsite.

We were joined by Don Allison in his Miata, and by Robin Matsumoto and Pepe. Three of us took cabins, but I was prepared to sleep with the troops if it rained. Dinner was pizza (meat and vegetarian) from Cobb. Z chaired the meeting, at which Ed Perry gave a historian's report detailing the life of the eponymous John Cobb and his influence on the area. The staff left as we were arriving, so I was unable to buy firewood. The onsite rooster started crowing about 2AM.

It starts with a ride up the challenging, but motorcycle-friendly, Morgan Territory Road, then over land borrowed from the Sacramento River (and on a free ferry!), and finally along the flank of the impressive Sutter Buttes to a classic delta sportsman's marina, where we will have grass camping and a covered area for the meeting. The marina has a restaurant and bar with a view of the river. If you are using your GPS, be sure that ferries aren't excluded, and you may have to unblock unpaved roads to route through Morgan Territory (it IS paved.)

The start is at the Railroad Café (833 E Stanley Blvd, Livermore; 925-447-0235), breakfast at 8 AM, leaving at 9. The meeting will be at 4 PM at Lovey's Landing (3474 N Meridian Rd, Meridian; 530-696-2449. Check the web page and Meetup for weather-related updates.

On February 21 the meeting is at Morro Bay. March 28 is Death Valley, where we have reservations for Friday, Saturday and Sunday night. On April 25 we will go to Bothe SP in the Napa Valley. May is reserved for the 49'er rally. The June 27 Election Meeting will be at Finnon Lake.

The board has moved the date of the July, 2015 meeting to the 18th, to avoid conflict with the MOA National in Billings. It will be held somewhere in the Eastern Sierra so that it can be a jumping-off for the national.



#### **NORCAL TECH SESSION:**



During the winter months the weather can be iffy and the predictability of rain lingers on any given day. Here in California we don't get the severe weather that the Midwest and the East get but we do get some rain, wind and fog.

We were lucky that on a brisk morning in November the sun came out just in time for our Club Tech Session. Kevin Livesly and Lorna graciously provided the venue for our R1200 valve adjustment Tech Session. Kevin is a popular guy and you can always count on his neighbors showing up along with his former co-workers Tim O'Connell and Chris Valverde. Our instructor was BMW certified Master Mechanic Sean McMichael and the motorcycle we worked on was an R1200RT.

After the work area was setup and the bike was on the lift with the help of a battery operated screw gun, the assorted fairing parts were removed from the RT and the engine was exposed. The spark plugs were removed to allow the engine to be turned more easily plus they were going to be replaced anyway. During this procedure, Shaun was a wealth of information pointing out short cuts and things to look for while you are "under the hood". One thing that I found interesting was a method he pointed out (specific to the RT) regarding the removal of screws and the way to keep from dropping them on to the ground or worse into the caverns and cubby holes of the engine, never to be found again. While this was going on, the engine oil was being drained and two fans were blowing on the front of the engine to help cool it down.

Once the engine had cooled down the business of valve adjustment was addressed. This model RT has the screw type valve adjustment as opposed to the bucket and shim type of the newer models. Once the valves were adjusted (they were tight) Shaun allowed everyone to "feel" the correct drag on the feeler gauge of a properly adjusted valve lash. A lot of head nodding and moments later, Sean was looking specifications up in his laptop regarding torque values and such and the bike went back together as quickly as it was disassembled.






The popularity of the F-Series motorcycles prompted us to address chain adjustment, sprocket replacement and general chain maintenance. Russ Drake did the honors in this arena. While there are plenty of videos on the web as well as articles on proper chain maintenance there is never a substitute for experience. Everyone has a favorite chain lube and some swear by the spray wax method (smells bad and builds up) but no one disagrees that as long as you keep the chain lubed you are ahead of the game. It's worth noting that chain longevity is dependent on how well you take care of it and that sprockets should be replaced along with the chain. While we didn't actually replace a chain during the Tech Session an opportunity presented itself to help out Justin Adams' bike. The rear sprocket has "Christmas Tree" and the chain had tight spots. By the time we got to change the chain/sprockets the rear sprocket teeth had started bending over.

We met at Russ Drake's house (Justin lives in Oakland) and in a couple of hours we had Justin on the road with a new set of sprockets and a new chain. Of course, once you start poking around your bike you will find something else wrong. In this instance, Justin also needed brakes but that is another article.

Kevin and Lorna thank you for the hospitality and for providing the venue as well as lunch. Also, thanks to Jacob Galina for working the grill and Master Mechanic Sean McMichael for sharing his knowledge and short cuts. Russ Drake has spent a lifetime around motorcycles and he is no stranger to their maintenance and thankfully he is always at the ready to help out a fellow motorcyclist. Thank you, Russ.
